Statement of subject matter:

- 1.To discuss continued campaign against CC and its members from Mr David Barrett, 6 Mitchell's Close, Haddington
- 2. Proposal to ban said member of the public from future meetings for a period of 1 year
- 3. Proposal to block said member of the public from active correspondence for a period of 1 year

Discussion of subject matter:

Members discussed the situation with continued harassment from said member of the public and despite reaching out both in person and in writing this continues. After discussion and taking advice from ELC it was decided we have no choice but to move to banning said members as above. Chair Chris McEwan stated that the updated Code of Conduct and Constitution will afford us more powers to deal with situations like this in the future.

Concerns from Morgwn about private meeting: Morgwn has previously voiced his concerns but on advice from ELC it was agreed the meeting should go ahead. Chris pointed out that certain private matters pertaining to this situation cannot and should not be discussed in a public forum, hence the private meeting.
