		Speedwatch proposals have been shared with community councils but responses have been slow. There is ambivalence about the scheme because this is seen as a job for the police, who are underfunded and don't have the officers to carry out this work. Communities would have to buy their own speed guns.	
		MD felt that this was the thin edge of the wedge. A discussion took place on the efficacy of the scheme which would not lead to prosecutions. TL felt that people should not carry out speed checks in their local area. MV thought that average-speed cameras would be a better solution.	
		JH pointed out that the CAPP report said there had been 2 road offenses but nothing for speeding and he wondered why not when speeding is a local priority, JW wondered how many people had been fined.
