6.	What counts as party political Matters?	
	SF has created the following definition for community councillors to follow: Party Politics and the HDCC	
	This discussion seems to have arisen because of confusion about the term party political.	
	The party-political rule does exist to ensure the CCs DO NOT oppose or promote political parties/candidates/ election campaigns. This means that the CC CANNOT campaign/endorse/ promote party manifestos.	
	A policy decision by ELC does not become off limits to the CC because elected members are involved. If that were the case CCs could not discuss anything because nearly everything at a local level involves decisions taken by elected members.	
	The key test for community councillors is:	

Are we discussing this issue because it affects local people?

The issues that affect local people include but are not limited to -

Rent/council tax rises

Housing

Local services

Planning

Crime

Transport

Public Health

Environmental concerns

CCs can add to this list perhaps and discuss priorities but none of these are 'political topics'.

The CC can hold elected members accountable, and they are expected to answer questions regardless of their political party.

The scrutiny of council policies is valid if there is a community concern, and in these cases, the CC should -

- •Focus on representing community interests without political bias.
- Ascertain/coordinate and express to the local authority and other agencies the community's views
- •Further the interests of their community in relation to all matters for which the local authority is responsible.

	 Speeding and Traffic - Speeding and traffic issues reported reflect the longstanding issues at Victoria Road - parents are parking in the road prior to the parking restrictions coming into force, then leaving before it 	

	ends. There has been no response fromTraffic to our email about the problems on the street. TL asked councillors to ask traffic wardens to police the area around the schools as their first port of call on days when in Haddington and issue fines if necessary. Incidents at Peachdales School Crossing -The speed sign at Peachdales is not working. Repeated requests for updates have gone unanswered. Hardgate/Sidegate/High Street Junction - The problems at this junction are a concern for both pedestrians and drivers and have been reported to us consistently. The biggest concern for pedestrians is that the parked cars and vans on the Hardgate block pedestrians' view of oncoming traffic when they try to cross the road at Church Street. Drivers also complain that the parking prevents them from staying in lane. Inadequate road markings have also been raised.	Councillor
